The Gospel today is on the prescribed priority of personal prayer. First, there is a **Promising Prelude**. Martha welcomes Jesus into her home. This is the beginning of prayer from our perspective. God always initiates prayer but we also answer his call and welcome him to the home of our soul. Next, there is the **Portrait of Prayer**. Her Sister Mary sits at the feet of the Lord and listens to him. Too many people forget that prayer is not just talking to God, it is also (and primarily) listening to God. Next, there is a Perturbed Presumptiveness that we see in Martha. Martha, burdened by the serving, says, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me all alone to do the serving? Tell her to help me!" First, she presumed that the Lord wanted a big meal. Second, she presumes that the Lord does not care. Finally, she presumes to tell Jesus what to do. None of these things she presumes are necessarily true. Perhaps the Lord did not want a big meal. He may have preferred to talk to the women and have them listen. Martha never really asked the Lord what he wanted. She just went to work. Finally, there is the Prescribed Priority. Jesus says that Mary has chosen the better part. The message of this Gospel is not that work should be balanced with prayer. The message is that prayer comes first. It is prior to action. It has priority. We are to do God's will but first we have to sit at his feet and listen so we know his will, not merely go off and do our own thing. In this sense Jesus calls prayer the "one thing necessary." Does this mean that work is unnecessary? No, but work is really meant to be an extension of prayer, and a prayer itself. It can only be this if sitting at the Lord's feet and listening precedes anything we call work.
