One of the images of the Church from Scripture is Christ crucified between two thieves. The fact is, we are all sinners and we have all used the gifts and things that belong to God in a way that is contrary to his will. To misuse things that belong to others is a form of theft and we are thus thieves. But one thief repented and strove to commit himself to Christ anew. Hopefully, we are that "good thief" and we too, though we sometimes fall and misuse the things that belong to God, we ask mercy and admittance into Christ's kingdom. On the Feast of Christ the King we do well to ask how we use the things that we call our own but which really belong to God. How do we use our time? Are we committed to pray and be at Mass every Sunday without fail? Do we use enough of our time to serve God and others or merely for selfish pursuits? What of our capacity to talk? Do we use our gift of speech to witness, to evangelize, or merely for small talk and gossip? What of our money? Are we faithful to the tithe? Are we generous enough to the poor and needy? Do we spend wisely or foolishly? Do we pay our debts in a timely way? Today is the Feast of Christ the King and we who call Christ our King must be willing to ask if he is really King and Lord of our time, talent, and treasure. In today's homily we have much to celebrate as a community as we reflect on this question. We also have need to reflect on how and where we can do a little better. May God bless us today to commit anew to the Kingship of Jesus Christ.
