In today's Gospel the Lord teaches on the Glory of Grace and what it means to find the perfect gift. The Gospel opens with the **DISCOURAGEMENT** of John the Baptist. He sends his disciples to Jesus asking if Jesus is the Messiah or not. This is a strange question in that John has already declared to others that Jesus IS the Messiah. Now he seems to have his doubts. Perhaps this is because John was expecting a wrathful and dramatic coming of the Messiah who would lay the axe to the root of the tree and destroy the wicked. But Jesus isn't doing this sort of thing. so John has doubt and discouragement. But next notice the **DISCLOSURE** by Jesus. He discloses God's plan to John, and us, and shows that he is in fact fulfilling Scripture as the blind see, the deaf hear, lepers are cleansed, the dead are raised and the poor hear the good news. John, and us, must come to accept God's ways, which are not always our ways. Judgment will come, but not before God offers the gift of grace to everyone. Jesus then gives the DIRECTIVE that we not be offended that he chooses to show mercy and give grace before the Judgment. Even John the Baptist, the greatest man born of woman is going to need this Grace. For great though he is in human terms, the least born into the Kingdom is greater than he. The greatest gift, the perfect gift, is grace. This Christmas, find the perfect gift, grace, and help others to do the same.
